Loud MD faces boot from loft

A TOP New York ER doctor is facing eviction from his posh Flatiron apartment building for throwing noisy all-night parties and infuriating wealthy neighbors including Vogue contributing editor **Lauren Santo Domingo**.

Dr. **Joseph Mirakhor**, an emergency-medicine specialist at New York Hospital Queens, rents his \$5 million loft at 31 W. 21st St. for \$12,000 a month. Sources tell us that Lauren, wife of wealthy Colombian **Andrés Santo Domingo**, and other neighbors are upset by Mirakhor's model-packed parties — for which they've dubbed him "Dr. Love" — that go on until 8:30 a.m. Police were called during one bash last month, and the parties have continued regularly ever since.

Mirakhor's loft is directly below Domingo's residence and a few floors below the penthouse used as **Shia LaBeouf's** character's home in "Wall Street: Money Never Sleeps."

Doreen Fischman, a lawyer for the owner of Mirakhor's loft, Vault.com media entrepreneur **Sam Hamadeh**, said: "The court has awarded us a judgment seeking to evict Dr. Mirakhor."

A source said residents are "up in arms about all-night noise, smoke and music, live bands and drunk people in the elevators," adding that building management has "arranged for a security firm to film guests and ID everyone from midnight until dawn."

The source added that Mirakhor, 31, has agreed to leave by the end of the year, but has also filed a response complaining about conditions in the apartment. Neighbors want him out earlier because he's broken a pledge not to have loud parties as long as he stays. The next court hearing is on Oct. 29.

Mirakhor's former lawyer, **Edward Shapiro**, said he's no longer working on the case and it wasn't clear if Mirakhor had hired a new lawyer. The doctor didn't respond to calls made to his office and family home. The Santo Domingos declined to comment.

A hospital rep said, "We do not provide information on employees regarding their employment or their private lives."
